“Finding a New and Deeper Rhythm”

I have lived the wonders of the local church. I have seen how a true spiritual family can show up for one another, encourage one another, forgive one another, and, in the tough times, hold faith for one another when our own faith fails. Such wonders are not as flashy as the wonders of the Grand Canyon or springtime showing off in all its flashy colors. They are more subtle, connecting with rhythms that are quieter, but so very exquisite.

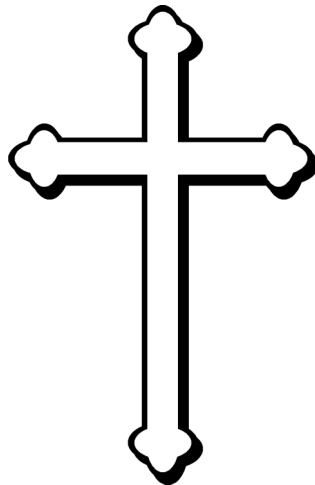
I was in the Duomo in Milan a couple of weeks ago – a last minute cheap flight - Air BNB - sort of post Easter excursion. As I sat in that Basilica with many others, staring up at the chancel, overwhelmed by that beautiful structure that took 600 years to complete and seats 40,000 worshippers; one of those with me said, “Despite all this beauty, I don’t think God lives here.” My response was, “It depends on how the people walk here. Are they loving? Are they filled with the Holy Spirit? Are they walking the way of Jesus? If these things are true, then God definitely dwells here.” That seems like a good enough answer to me.

But the doubt expressed by that individual reminded me of the challenges we have as a church today. In fact, it is the universal problem all churches seem to share right now. In a rapidly changing cultural and communications landscape, how do church buildings and budgets and programs fit in? How can the subtle rhythms of a local church be felt when competing for time with streaming sites, 50-70 hour dual work weeks, round the clock cable news, team sports on Sunday, and so many other things competing for our time, allegiance, and attention?

The answer, I think, is that the Church cannot compete. The competition, instead, is within us. Do we believe in the way of Jesus Christ, and are we willing to form our time and attention around that way? Do we believe that the gospel matters, and are we willing to give up something to find that more subtle wonder, the beautiful rhythm of a deeper kind of community? Are we willing to do whatever it takes to be the church in and for our world? The church cannot compete with the world if the world has already won within us.

The wonders of the church might be more subtle, but finding a new and deeper rhythm by which to live our lives, is infinitely richer. It's not a new rhythm at all – it's the ancient rhythm that has always been there, even before the foundations of the world.

Come. Let us walk the old path. Let us pray and dance and sing to the ancient rhythm together.

Remote Giving

How to transition to EFT (Electronic Fund Transfer)

Electronic Fund transfer is a way of giving on a schedule via your bank to FPC's bank. Signing up is simple. Provide the following information to Cindy Fields; account number, routing number, amount of contribution, date of withdraw (the 1st, the 16th, or both).

You may provide this information by;

- Sending in a voided check – write on your check the date of withdrawal and the amount.
- Email – only if you are comfortable with this. Please triple check your account numbers for accuracy.
- Calling in – Our voicemail is secure so you can leave all information if no one answers.

Your contributions will continue until you confirm a stop date. You may make contributions to anything through EFT including Caring Ministry.



Online Giving

Online Giving gives you the freedom to control your giving on your schedule and type of payment. Here are instructions:

- 1) Go to www.fpcyork.org and find the GIVE NOW button at the top right of the screen. Clicking on this will take you directly to the FPC giving platform.
- 2) From here you will select the category to which you would like to give and enter the amount.
- 3) Scroll down and select the donation frequency (one time, weekly, monthly, etc.)
- 4) Select a start date. Click Continue.
- 5) Enter your personal information, name, address, account info. It is suggested to create a password so you can access or edit your giving information at a later date.
- 6) Remember to tap the process button.

The Conclusion of the 2023-2024 Abendmusik/East Market Organ Series

Thanks to everyone who came out for Dan's organ concert last month. It was a delightfully French musical expression. Now we turn our attention to our final concert of both concert series this year. On June 8, at 4 p.m., we will host the Anne C. Hoover Memorial Concert, featuring our headline organist for the year, Frank Zilinyi. Frank is a graduate of Oberlin and University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music, with notable studies with Roberta Gary. He has enjoyed a fruitful career as an organist and church musician from Nashville to Northern CT, and is currently the Director of Music and Principal Organist at South Church in New Britain, CT. He recently presented a concert as part of the Pipes Alive Series at St. John's Episcopal in West Hartford, CT, and has performance credentials far and wide. He is a dear friend of Dan's and will be making his southern PA debut with this concert. The concert is in memory of Anne Hoover, the late wife of Ben Hoover, who was a tremendous supporter of music and an organ enthusiast.

Music Celebration Sunday- Sunday June 2nd, at both services

We will celebrate the wonderful work of the Music Ministry in our midst, with our Annual Music Celebration Sunday on June 2. The theme will be “The Third Road,” which will center around a landmark piece of music - Randall Thompson’s setting of Robert Frost’s poem, “The Road Not Taken.” There will be special music, a special message from Dan Brownell, and a number of special announcements. First, we will unveil the 2024-2025 Abendmusik Series, and you’ll be able to see the great music we have coming next year. Second, the new Music Ministry website pages will go live, which will hopefully increase our web presence.

While the date is still uncertain (it will hopefully be Music Sunday), the release of Dan’s album and the fundraising implications, will occur in the next couple months.

We also hope that Dan will be able to do some stadium organ playing as well. And starting June 23, we will launch our summer music program, where all will be invited to make music for God in worship during the summer months. More information to come.

Mission Update

For the past several months we have been using this Mission Update column to present the ministries and missions that FPC supports annually with a line item in the Mission Budget. Those that we have featured to date have been “out-of-town” ministries: Carmel School in Tamil Nadu, India; the Okello’s in Kenya; Jess and Jason Stanier in Capetown, South Africa; the Faders who currently serve the people of Burundi, South Sudan, and Uganda; and Sean McFeely with Oasis Ministry on the West Coast. We have two additional ministries here in York that receive a fixed annual gift from our Mission Budget. These are Logos Academy and Joy El Ministries.

Logos Academy is a private Christian school that has been offering a classical and Christ-centered education to students in York County for over 25 years. Because 65% of Logos’ students are from families that are at or below the poverty level, the York Christian Community helps support a scholarship program to provide tuition assistance, as well as classroom materials, so that every child might have a chance to achieve their God-given potential, regardless of their economic status. FPC has had a long history of support and cooperation with Logos. One of the founders of the school was a member of FPC at the time of its startup, and the Kerr building provided the first classrooms for their elementary students. They have come a long way with buildings of their own, but still need help from the York Christian Community to provide for the children who need financial assistance. FPC has been one of those supporters for 25 years.

Joy El is an evangelistic ministry seeking to provide opportunities for people to experience “life-change through personal encounters with God.” Their motto is “Igniting a generation that seeks Him.” They offer a pull-out program in York County Schools whereby the children are excused one hour a week for religious education.

Elementary students learn about Jesus through “Bible Adventure”, while the middle schoolers’ study is called “Christians in Action.” JoyEl also provides camps and retreats year round for all ages. Three buses recently transported 133 students and volunteers from the York area to their Bible Adventure Weekend, where they had opportunities to grow in knowledge and love of the Lord. At present there are 143 students and 67 volunteers participating from 6 York City Schools.

Our hope is that you now have an understanding of the kind of missions our FPC pledges support every year. In addition to these fixed annual contributions, the Mission Committee has budgeted undesignated funds for both overseas and local missions. These funds help support new missions in our community and abroad and can be made immediately available to assist with unanticipated emergencies. These funds also enable us to support the Caring Ministry, and help with Neighborhood Meals, Christmas Hospitality, and national and international disaster relief as needed. These funds enabled us to purchase Bibles in Spanish and Creole for members and visitors who do not read English, and to respond to community partners in ministry when unexpected needs arise.

Over the years, we have contributed to New Life for Girls and New Life for Children, the Salvation Army, LifePath Christian Ministries, Habitat for Humanity, Young Life and Young Lives, to name a few that should be familiar to Yorkers. When our members hear of new ministries that are starting up or are personally working to meet a need in the name of Jesus, the Mission Committee wants to hear from you. We try to be as generous as possible when confronted with genuine need. We ask your prayers that FPC might continue to be a blessing to those in need in the York Community and around the world.

CARING MINISTRY



Gratitude can appear in many different forms - kind words, a note, a phone call or conversation, a caring act, or a simple gesture. At the Caring Ministry, we are humbled to receive words of thanks from our neighbors, especially in regard to the Client Choice food appointments and the quantity and wide selection of food choices. These words demonstrate the neighbors' gratitude for the time and effort that the Caring

Ministry staff and volunteers give to ensure that those who are without receive help.

Recently, I had the chance to assist neighbors by checking them in for their Client Choice food appointments. Even though the pace of the experience can be hectic with answering the door and keeping up with the questions and registration, the time spent with the neighbors is rewarding. We have the rare opportunity to catch a glimpse of someone else's life and the journey that they are experiencing - their joys and concerns, their highs and lows, their thoughts and feelings. On this particular day, I was blessed and humbled by one woman's ability to refocus my purpose.

She shared with me how grateful she and her neighbors are for the services that the Caring Ministry provides for the neighborhood and for the kindness and care that we show. Then, she told me that she and her group of friends are praying for the Caring Ministry. She acknowledged that while she may not be able to give much back to the Caring Ministry, she can pray for the work we do, the people we serve, and the wellbeing of the staff and volunteers. As she stated so well, "We give all the glory to God. We thank him first and then we thank his servants next. He said you are all God's servants who make a difference."

We are blessed. The love of God shines through, not just in the acts of those who are willing to give of their time and of their resources, but also in those who receive. This individual's words renewed my strength, energy, and passion for this ministry! She reminded me of the power of prayer and the positive ripple effect that one person's actions can have on a ministry, and more specifically, on one person's life.

Now, I want to share that kindness, compassion, and gratitude with each of you. The stocked shelves due to the many generous donations, the music, the prayers, the kind words – you are serving God and making a difference in our neighbors' lives, just as the neighbors are also impacting our lives. We offer a big thank you to each of you for supporting the Caring Ministry and its service to the York community, with a special thank you to our "praying neighbors." We are praying for you, too!

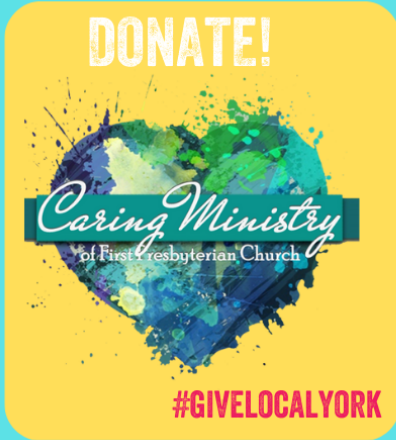

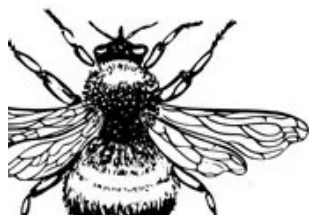
